TROPHY HISTORY

Joy Roberts Family Memorial Trophy

The KAS presents the Roberts Family Memorial Trophy as a way of recognising the contribution made to the society by Stan Roberts, his wife, and daughter over about seventy years from just after the Great Depression of the 1930s, when Stan Roberts was central in the re-establishment of the Kelmscott Show after years of recession.

In 1938 he began a multi-year period as President, while his daughter, Joy, spent many years as a councillor, ending at the end of the twentieth century.

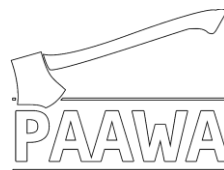
He came to Kelmscott first in 1902 and died at 86 in 1960. He lived with his wife and three daughters on what was then Lefroy Road (now Roberts Road).

It was people like the Roberts who helped the Kelmscott Agricultural Society become the vibrant and significant aspect of life in this corner of the Perth metropolitan area that it is.

Definitions

Novice: A person who is beginning to learn an activity and has little or no experience or skill in it.

Amateur: A person who engages in the activity for their own pleasure, who does not conduct or promote a business in the activity and/or who does not conduct themselves as a professional (i.e., not a person who conducts judging, training, etc.).

Hobbyist: A person who sells their items as a hobby but does not have a registered business (a stall at local markets).
